Major Gifts Propel Capital Campaign Over \$1.5 Million!



Since January, an additional \$500,000 has been raised for the Capital Campaign! With your support, we are half-way to our local goal of raising \$3 million for the second Pittsburgh Fisher House! Groundbreaking on the new 16-room house on the H. John Heinz III VA campus in O'Hara township is slated for 2024 with doors opening in 2025. Donations from you and your colleagues throughout the community are making the dream of a second Fisher House in Pittsburgh a reality!

Highlights from spring donations include a \$250,000 grant from a local foundation, over \$50,000 from the Pirates and Penguins, \$47,000 from the special project of the Commander of the VFW of PA, over \$41,000 raised at a special event at the Edgeworth Club in Sewickley, and \$10,000 from community fundraisers to benefit the capital campaign. With the leadership of Deb Walton and Dee Rink of Coldwell Banker Realty, the capital campaign committee threw their first capital campaign event. Rocky Bleier opened the evening and <u>Eric McElvenny</u> shared how beneficial a Fisher House had been for him and his family following his injury while he was stationed in Afghanistan. Eric's mom, Susan, affirmed the importance of Fisher House. Their family spent a very memorable Christmas together at a Fisher House while Eric recuperated. *"The Fisher House was something we didn't know we needed; but wouldn't have survived without it!"* Susan's words echo the sentiments of so many families of veterans who receive free lodging at the Fisher House – for as long as they need it – while they support their loved ones in the hospital.

To date the evening raised over \$41,000 from gifts, pledges, and appreciated securities and more is anticipated. This boosts the campaign total to over \$1.5 million, which is halfway to the \$3 million local fundraising goal!
